



Cyber Safety and Security Team Leader



Prerequisites

Course objectives

- Offers cadets the opportunity to meet cybersecurity experts
 within the Canadian Armed Forces, learn about security
 measures in Windows and Linux and take part in a cybersecurity
 competition.
- Cadets who successfully complete this course can be certified as Cyber Security Team Leaders. This will help them practise safe behaviours online and be ready to lead cybersecurity activities in their cadet corps or squadron.

SUPPORT SERVICES TEAM LEADER (SSTL)

SMALL CRAFT COXSWAIN



Prerequisite

Course objectives

- The Small Craft Coxswain course gives cadets the opportunity to learn about boat operations, restrictions and navigation. They will also learn about aspects of communication on the water, such as distress signals, Maritime Mobile Service and radio operations.
- Upon successful completion of this course, cadets can obtain the SCOP Module 1 (Pleasure Craft Operator Card) and SCOP Module 2 (Restricted Operator's Certificate (Maritime) card) qualifications.
- Cadets who successfully complete this course are eligible for Transport Canada certification.

BASIC MICRODRONE OPERATOR

Course objectives

- The Basic Microdrone Operator course gives cadets the opportunity to learn about UAVs in the Canadian Armed Forces, prepare for the Transport Canada Basic Operations Pilot Certificate exam, obtain their Transport Canada Restricted Operator Certificate (Aeronautical) and explore careers involving UAVs.
- Cadets who successfully complete this course are eligible for Transport Canada certification.

Survival instructor Course





Air rifle marksmanship instructor




