DEPUTY CHIEF OF STAFF - PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT AND CULTURE

Brigadier-General Lockhart enrolled in the Canadian Armed Forces in 1990, graduated from the Collège militaire royal de Saint-Jean (CMR Saint-Jean) and joined the Royal Canadian Regiment. He spent 10 years on Regimental Duty split between Second Battalion in Gagetown and primarily Third Battalion in Petawawa. Twice deployed as a rifle platoon commander in Bosnia, and was later deployed twice to Afghanistan, followed by twice to the greater Middle East. He had the privilege of commanding the Canadian Forces Land Advanced Warfare Centre from 2011 to 2013, guiding the modernization of the Canadian Army's mountaineering, arctic, pathfinder and parachute training programs. Following a year at US CENTCOM HQ, Brigadier-General Lockhart was appointed Director of Cadets at the Royal Military College of Canada (RMC). In June 2023 he was assigned to his current appointment as Deputy Chief of Staff-Professional Conduct and Culture and was promoted to his current rank on 20 Oct 2023.

Brigadier-General Lockhart has served in many roles in Ottawa, including Executive Assistant to the Vice Chief of the Defence Staff, and Chief of Staff to Chief of Programme. He holds an Honours Degree in Military and Strategic Studies de CMR, and a Masters of Defence Studies from Royal Military College of Canada (RMC) Kingston.

He and his wife have two daughters.

<u>Awards</u>

Most Valuable Drill Team Member

The Most Valuable Drill Team Member Award is presented to the member of the Drill Team who is considered to have demonstrated commitment, and leadership to the team as well as perseverance and self-improvement through the year, as decided on by the Drill Team Commander and Coach.

Best Instructor – The Commanding Officer Plaque

The "Commanding Officer" plaque is presented to the Cadet Instructor with the best instructional techniques. This award recognizes the cadet who has shown outstanding skill in effectively delivering training, engaging cadets, and fostering a positive learning environment. The recipient exemplifies the qualities of clarity, patience, adaptability, and leadership in their role as an instructor. The recipient of this award is decided upon by the Training staff, along with the Trg NCO. Input from other staff members and senior cadets who were involved with any instruction should be included as well. This award may be presented to any cadet.

Best Junior Non-Commissioned Officer

The Best Junior Non-Commissioned Officer plaque is presented to the cadet junior noncommissioned officer (Jr NCO) who has shown outstanding self-improvement and achieved exceptional performance at all levels of training and leadership. This award recognizes a cadet who has demonstrated leadership, responsibility, and dedication to their role, consistently going above and beyond in their duties. This award may be presented to any Jr NCO who are, by definition, only Corporals (Cpl) and Flight Corporals (FCpl).

"Major Marc Moo Sang" Best Senior Non-Commissioned Officer

The Best Senior Non-Commissioned Officer plaque is presented to the cadet senior noncommissioned officer (Sr NCO) who has shown outstanding self-improvement and achieved exceptional performance at all levels of training and leadership. This award recognizes a cadet who has demonstrated leadership, responsibility, and dedication to their role, consistently going above and beyond in their duties. This award may be presented to any Sr NCO who are, by definition, a sergeant (Sgt) or Flight Sergeant (FSgt), not a Warrant Officer (WO).

Most Improved

The Most Improved Cadet award is presented to the cadet who has improved the most during the training year. This does not imply that the recipient is the best cadet overall of all the nominees. It means that they have had the biggest improvement since the previous training year.

Military Drill Trophy

Awarded to the cadet who has developed alertness, precision, pride, steadiness, and the cohesion necessary for success within a group, and demonstrates the highest level of drill knowledge and ability in the Squadron.

Sportsmanship and Esprit de Corps

As an homage to the original founding sponsors of 51 squadron, "Les Club Optimiste d'Ottawa" Trophy is presented to the cadet who has been exemplary in his conduct and attitude towards others during all activities. This is not to be confused with spirit or enthusiasm. While these two qualities are likely also demonstrated by the recipient, this award has more to do with their behaviour towards others. This award may be presented to any cadet.

The Squadron Leader Award

The squadron leader award is presented to the cadet voted on by their fellow cadets in the squadron as the individuals who helped them the most during the year and best exemplifies the aims of the air cadet movement.

Dress and Deportment

The Dress and Deportment award is presented to the cadet who demonstrated exemplary dress and deportment. This includes consistently wearing the uniform above standard and having the ability and willingness to assist peers in meeting the standard, and the way they conduct themselves during cadet activities such as showing appropriate respect to subordinates and superiors, knowing and following the rules, etc. This award may be presented to any cadet.

Canada Aviation and Space Museum Trophy

The Canada Aviation and Space Museum Trophy is presented to the top candidate of the flying scholarship having received the highest marks in the Squadron Flying Scholarship Program on the written test administered by the Air Cadet League.

Volunteer of the Year

Awarded to a cadet for noteworthy display of effort and dedicated participation throughout the year in the most cadet volunteer activities, whether that be fundraising or for community service.

MVP Marksmanship Team Member

The Most Valuable Marksmanship Team Member Award is presented to the member of the Marksmanship Team who is considered to be the most valuable team member (Team

member who most supported the team and its members throughout the training year), as decided by the Marksmanship Team and its coaches.

Flying Officer T.J. Olson Top Marksman Most Improved Trophy

The Flying Officer T.J. Olson Most Improved Marksman Trophy is awarded to the Marksman who, through perseverance, has made the most improvement throughout the training year as decided by the Marksmanship Team coach.

MVP Biathlon Team Member

The Most Valuable Biathlon Team Member Award is presented to the member of the Biathlon Team who is considered to be the most valuable team member (based on criteria that includes promoting team spirit by motivating its members throughout the training year), as decided by the Biathlon Team and its coaches.

Hurley Award of Excellence

The "Hurley Award of Excellence" is presented to the cadet or cadets who achieved excellence in the sport of biathlon in the current training year, may be presented to an individual or a team, as decided by the Biathlon Team and its coaches.

MVP Band Member

The "Major Sylvie McMillan" Trophy is presented to the cadet who contributed the most to the development of the band during the year. Decided by the Band members and their instructors.

Most Improved Band Member

The Most Improved Most Improved Band Member award is presented to the Band member who has improved the most throughout the training year. Decided by the Band members and their instructors.

The Royal Canadian Legion - Eastview Branch 462 Award for Dedication and Commitment

Presented to 2 Cadet Recruits who have demonstrated exceptional dedication, perseverance, and commitment throughout the training year. This award recognizes a cadet who upholds the core values of the Canadian Cadet Program; loyalty, professionalism, mutual respect, and integrity while embodying the spirit of service that defines the Royal Canadian Legion and its contributions to the community.

Best Flight Cadet

Awarded to the cadets who showed the most improvement, esprit de corps, camaraderie, and team spirit and overall had a good attitude and good dress and deportment in their flights. As decided by flight staff.

Air Cadet Service Medal

To qualify for the Air Cadet Service Medal, a cadet must have successfully completed four years of continuous honourable service with no serious infractions and be recommended by the Squadron Commanding Officer.

Royal Canadian Legion Cadet Medal of Excellence

The Royal Canadian Legion (RCL) Cadet Medal of Excellence is awarded in recognition for individual endeavours in citizenship that meet or enhance the aims and objectives of the cadet movement.

Lord Strathcona Medal

The Lord Strathcona Medal is one of the highest awards that can be granted to a cadet. It demonstrates all that Lord Strathcona himself personified: hard work, dedication, service to Canada, excellence in all pursuits, vision, perseverance and intelligence and a focus on stewardship of our country; its health and vibrancy and that of its youth.
